# RESOLUTION OF THE NASSAU COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (THE "AGENCY") ADOPTING A RECORD RETENTION AND DISPOSITION POLICY AND ADDRESSING OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the Nassau County Industrial Development Agency (the "Agency") is authorized and empowered by the provisions of Chapter 1030 of the 1969 Laws of New York, constituting Title I of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law, Chapter 24 of the Consolidated Laws of New York, as amended (the "Enabling Act"), and Chapter 674 of the 1975 Laws of New York, as amended, constituting Section 922 of said General Municipal Law (said Chapter and the Enabling Act being hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Act") to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of manufacturing, industrial and commercial facilities, among others, for the purpose of promoting, attracting and developing economically sound commerce and industry to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State of New York, to improve their prosperity and standard of living, and to prevent unemployment and economic deterioration; and

WHEREAS, the Agency wishes to adopt a record retention and disposition policy to ensure continued compliance with current best practices in governance and applicable law, including, without limitation, the Public Authorities Accountability Act of 2005 and the Public Authorities Reform Act of 2009; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 57-A of the Arts and Cultural Affairs Law of the State of New York (the "Arts Law"), the Agency must formally adopt the applicable records retention and disposition schedule before disposing of any records listed in such schedule;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. In accordance with Article 57-A of the Arts Law, Records Retention and Disposition Schedule MI-1 (the "Schedule"), containing legal minimum retention periods for local government records, is hereby adopted for use by all officers and employees of the Agency in legally disposing of valueless records listed in the Schedule.
- Section 2. In accordance with Article 57-A of the Arts Law, (a) only those records will be disposed of that are described in the Schedule after they have met the minimum retention periods described therein, and (b) only those records will be disposed of that do not have sufficient administrative, fiscal, legal or historical value to merit retention beyond established legal minimum periods.

- Section 3. The Agency hereby determines that the proposed action is a Type II Action pursuant to Article 8 of the New York Environmental Conservation Law (including the regulations thereunder, "SEQRA") involving "continuing agency administration" which does not involve "new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment" (6 NYCRR §617.5(c)(20)) and therefore no Findings or determination of significance are required under SEQRA.
- Section 4. The Agency hereby authorizes the Chairman, the Executive Director and the Administrative Director to take all steps necessary to implement the matters described herein. The Administrative Director is hereby appointed the Records Management Officer of the Agency.
- Section 5. This Resolution shall not preclude the Agency from adopting other or further policies relating to governance and activities of the Agency as determined from time to time by the members of the Agency.
  - Section 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
